

Colonial Coins and Tokens



- 1278 1652 Massachusetts "Pine Tree" Shilling, Small Planchet. Noe-16. VF, restored.** 68 grains. The surfaces appear, at first glance, to be strictly original. In Colonial days, this example had a small hole drilled through the top. It has now been professionally restored, along with the first N in ENGLAND, and a few of the denticles, which have been re-engraved. A wonderful display piece. **(\$1,500-2,500)**

- 1279 1724 Wood's Hibernia Halfpenny. Extremely Fine.** Sharply struck with matte-like surfaces. There is an heavy die crack through the first two digits of the date, making this a very interesting variety. **(\$250-350)**



- 1280 1778/79 Rhode Island Ship Token in Brass, Wreath Below Ship, PCGS XF-40.** Betts 563, Breen 1141. Medium brown with darker mottling. A scarce and popular type. The reverse shows American forces fleeing Rhode Island under assault by the British. The Dutch legends are a mystery, but it is believed by some that the piece was meant to dissuade the Dutch from signing a treaty that might have benefited the Americans. **(\$1,500-1,800)**



- 1281 1739-B French Colonies. Sou Marque. Ch AU** with a goodly amount of mint lustre remaining. **(\$350-500)**

- 1282 1767 French Colonies. Sou, without counterstamp. Near EF,** but with a bit of corrosion. Nice overall light brown color. **(\$250-350)**



- 1283 1767-A French Colonies Copper Sou or Sol de 12 Deniers, with "RF" counterstamp. PCGS EF-40.** Mostly chestnut in color with some minor surface soiling. The counterstamp is very bold. **(\$250-350)**

- 1284 1783 Nova Constellatio. Small US, blunt rays. VF,** slightly porous. Comes with auction card from Bowers and Ruddy Galleries, lot #02005 from June 15-17, 1981 "Earl Victor Tuttle Collection". **(\$250-350)**



- 1285 1785 Connecticut Copper, "African Head". Miller 4.1F.4. Very Fine-35.** 140.2 grains. Strong detail for this type, with uniformly porous surfaces. Struck slightly off-center on the reverse, separating the date from the rim by a wide margin. A very popular due to the distinctive obverse, and listed in the Guidebook as a separate variety. **(\$500-750)**



- 1286 1786 Connecticut Copper. "Hercules Head" variety. Miller 5.3-N. VF-EF.** 131.1 grains. Dark brown, with lighter high points. The surfaces are slightly porous, but still quite pleasing. One of the nicest examples of this type we have offered in a while. **(\$750-1,250)**



- 1287 1787 Connecticut Copper, Draped Bust Left. Miller 33.2-Z.5. PCGS VF-30.** 135.0 grains. Well struck, nicely centered, with a full date. Smooth surfaces, medium to dark chocolate brown, with somewhat lighter highpoints. **(\$275-375)**



1288 1787 New Jersey Copper. Pronounced Outline Around Shield. Maris 48-g. PCGS About Uncirculated-50. Light brown, evenly struck throughout. A well centered, and very attractive. The perfect New Jersey "type" coin. **(\$1,750-2,250)**



1289 1786 Vermont Cent. "Vermontensium" RR-8. VF, porous with dark toning. Rare in any condition. **(\$400-700)**



1290 1788 Vermont Cent. RR-27. EF detail. Somewhat granular, but pleasant surfaces. **(\$750-1,250)**



1291 1788 Vermont Copper, Mailed Bust Right, Ryder 27. PCGS VF-30. 128.0 grains. Medium brown. Some porosity in the planchet, and some minor edge bruises, but by no means distracting. Ex Dr. Robert I. Hinkley and Perry Collections. **(\$750-1,250)**

1292 1789 Mott Token, New York. Thick edge PCGS MS-62. Mahogany toned. **(\$1,500-2,200)**



1293 1794 Talbot, Allum & Lee Cent, With New York. Proof-65. Light chestnut-brown with deeply mirrored surfaces that reflect traces of iridescent blue and violet. The devices are lightly frosted, and every detail is delightfully distinct. Perhaps a handful exist, and they rarely appear at auction. Much scarcer than the 1795 Proof. A wonderful opportunity for the advanced collector of Colonial coinage. **(\$2,500-3,500)**



1294 1760 Voce Populi Halfpenny. Nelson-9. PCGS AU-55. Glossy brown, with some traces of luster. **(\$1,000-1,500)**



1295 1787 Fugio Cent, 8-Pointed Stars on Reverse, STATES / UNNITED. Newman 15-Y. PCGS AU-50. One of the finest examples known of this variety. Both of the stars in the central ring are distinct, and the planchet is free of defects. Rarely found better than VF, and unpriced in the Guidebook above EF. An excellent opportunity to add a high grade example to your collection, and worthy of a premium bid. **(\$2,000-3,000)**
